2. Answer any **ten** of the following questions:

– Who is referred to here as 'I'? Why did he roam with a hungry heart?

b) "Your leave for one more last ride with me."

– Who seeks the permission and from whom?

c) "The sea is calm to-night,

The tide is full, the moon lies fair

Upon the straits ..."

– Which 'sea' is referred to here? Describe the ambience.

d) "I have looked upon those brilliant creatures,

And now my heart is sore"

– Who are those brilliant creatures? What is the mental condition of the speaker?

e) What is curtal sonnet? Give an example.

- f) "The land's sharp features seemed to be
The Century's corpse outleant"
– Which century is referred to here? How did the century turn to corpse?
- g) "In the room women come and go
Talking of Michelangelo."
– Who is Michelangelo? Why do the 'women' talk of Michelangelo?
